In deze nieuwsbrief blikken we terug op wat er dit jaar is bereikt .



Er is in Nepal een flinke stap gezet richting democratie.

Zo zijn er in verkiezingen gehouden, voor het eerst in 20 jaar. Dharan heeft een nieuwe burgemeester dhr Tara Subba die ook onze Dipendraschool heeft bezocht.

We hebben de plannen uitgewerkt om de Dipendraschool verder te ontwikkelen. De bijdrage van de Rotary Club te Hulst voor nieuwe klaslokalen zal door de plaatselijke Rotary Club in Dharan worden ondersteund met een bijdrage voor de

inventaris..

Het verzamelen van gegevens om zicht te krijgen op de vaak schrijnende omstandigheden thuis van de kinderen die op Dipendraschool zitten , begint vorm te krijgen. Hierdoor wordt zichtbaar hoe belangrijk de school is om deze kinderen tenminste op school een schone en veilige omgeving te bieden! Enkele voorbeelden van kinderen die het betreft verderop in de nieuwsbrief.

Verder een kort verslag van de busreis deze herfst voor de oudere weeskinderen uit Duhabi en Sarasvati home naar Kathmandu, waar ze o.a kennis hebben gemaakt met enkele betrouwbare werkgevers zodat ze niet bv naar Qatar hoeven te gaan om daar gevaarlijk werk te doen.

Ook een voorlopig financieel overzicht over 2017 en een begroting van het bedrag dat we in 2018 nodig hebben.

We laten u zien wat we met uw bijdrage zoal kunnen realiseren voor de kinderen.

Part 1

The following overview gives an idea of what we can do with your donation:

Duhabi Kinderhuis:



In Duhabi Children's Home (16 children) we can offer a child a safe place for an amount of about € 50 pm. School costs, clothing, footwear, food, homework assistance, care are included. Accompaniment by the home and cook mother: they earn resp € 60 and € 40 per month (24 /7) A home teacher gets € 60 p. The coordinator earns approximately € 80 pm.

Various Project costs, such as repair of earthquake damage, maintenance of the building and others are not covered here. A small part of the total budget is funded from local donations.

Dipendra School:

There are now 112 children at school, 35 of whom are in nursery school. The children are offered education in 5 classes. A teacher now gets about € 50 pm. There are 6 teachers and a (part-time) cook who work. This cook earns approximately € 15 pm.



The children receive a daily meal and fruit at school as well as a school uniform, shoes. The uniforms and shoes cost about € 28 per child. They receive a sweater, belt, socks, underwear, school bag and also the uniform. The meal and fruit cost about € 0.37 per child per day. This meal program is generously sponsored by Stichting Kinderen van de Wereld!



Plan:

Quality improvement through data collection in Dipendra School:

Many school children face difficulties in their home situation, like extreme poverty, lack of hygienic, domestic violence, alcoholism.

Data collection process has started by the teachers of Dipendra School so that we can help these children in their education. . So with effective resources from data collection, we want to improve the situation of the families and children from Dalit community and offer child various possibilities for successful future. The teachers are paid euro 24 monthly on top of their salary (euro 42 monthly) for this extra and most necessary work.

Extra classrooms:

4 extra classrooms are needed to be able to expand the school to 8 courses and also to extend Kindergarten 1. This is due to a change in the education law to gain recognition (and access to public funds) Costs of the classrooms amount to approx. € 32,000.

Construction of Boundary wall:

Fence around the school grounds is necessary for the safety of the school and the children (approx. 30x70 m) this costs around €13000.-The situation is urgent because of the landless people who will build a hut if we do not start construction soon.

Connecting link with employment/internship Program:

Children who are over 18 from Children home needs to be involved for various job opportunities. They have been introduced by us in a program that provides employment for orphans. The youths need various vocational trainings and accommodation. We hope some young adults find employment in reliable, innovative Nepalese companies that are connected with the Rockstart program (companies receiving investments and coaching by Dutch companies.) We expect extra costs for vocational training and lodging will be around € 85 monthly per youth.

Improving of salary to the teachers of Dipendra School is essential:

The extra contribution from the Municipality of Dharan has been canceled due to lack of resources from the local government. However, they pay the salary €49 to the toddler's teacher and recently have added a new teacher in toddlers.

Here are some examples of what this year has been achieved in our projects:

- ***Duhabi wall restoration completed***

Restoration of wall completed after strike of massive earthquake in Nepal. The restoration of wall has been provided a safe environment for the Children of Duhabi home.



- ***Data collection started by Teachers of Dipendra School.***

Teachers of Dipendra School have been started doing data collection of the Children as well as family located near Falkland area. They are being supported by office manager of SHC in analyzing the data and reporting. We hope to find out about the needs of children who are not safe at home and how we can support them!



Ram and Laxman are twins and staying in Falkland area with their grandfather and grandmother. They are studying in Dipendra School. According to the teachers, they found the condition of the home very bad through collection of the data.

They are living in a very pathetic condition. Their parents have left them already and don't care about them. Ram and Laxman's grandmother gathers some woods in the jungle and sell them in the market and earns some money for the family. Ram and Laxman's grandfather has been suffering from tuberculosis and doesn't work.

They are going to school without proper clothes and also they are under-weight due to lack of proper nutrition and healthy diets. Their grandfather and grandmother are very much busy so they cannot look after their personal hygiene and also they don't give them proper care. The family condition is very low. Though local municipality constructed the houses but it is not completed properly due to corruption by local agents. The total area of the house is approximately 19 square meters. The condition of the house is very bad. The house hasn't been cemented properly and also there are two rooms inside the house where in one room, all the children and family are sleeping. According to the information, the children are sleeping on the floor as there are no such beds and mats for sleeping.



And the next room is the kitchen room where there is no such utensils to cook food. The food materials are also not sufficient. Though they get some local support of food materials like rice, pulse, gram, beans etc. from some local organization monthly but it is not sufficient for them. As a result, Children are becoming the victim of malnutrition.

So, with the support of local people and legal authorities, a plan has been processed in order to make possibilities for them to live in Duhabi Children home where they can have a good future and necessities needed for them.

Stichting sponsored shelter (hut) for Mr. Home Bahadur Pariyar which is in the same condition and right now Mr. Home and his Children are living there. Mr. Home Bahadur's wife has expired due to Jaundice as they didn't have a good income to cure the disease. Mr. Home works very hard though he doesn't have good income to feed his family. He works in other people's fields, sometimes does other work of nearby houses and those people give him some food materials where he brings that small amount of food materials and cook and serve his family.



His two Children are studying in Dipendra School and he is right now involved in local works. No support is received to this family from outside. As a result, due to insufficient balanced diet, Children are becoming the victim of malnutrition.

- ***Summer holidays activities in Dipendra School***



Dipendra School had successfully completed summer holiday activities during July where many indoor and outdoor games for children were organized with different prizes and meals as well. The Children were very much excited to perform various activities in School.

- ***New office manager in SHC***

After resignation of the previous manager, new office manager Mr. Puran Baraily (24) has been appointed as a manager in SHC. He was referred by Mr. Meherman Hughes, board member of SHC. Puran is devoted to work for the underprivileged children!



Part 3

Feedback from Children about educational Tour 2017

Educational tour was one of the successful events organized by SHC where Children including other members were participated from Duhabi and Saraswati Children home. Basically, Children were very much happy that they got a chance to visit carious places as well as learn more about Rockstart related companies that can possibly provide a job after their studies are completed.

Below are some of the feedbacks from Children about educational tour.

- **Riju Gautam:**

“It was the first time for me to go to Kathmandu. So I almost liked every part of the educational tour. I liked various historical places like Patan Durbar square, Bhaktapur durbar where I saw the most beautiful places during my tour. I also saw the repair and maintenance works that were going on for building of the temples which made me more interesting. I liked the architecture of gods and goddesses carved on stones and woods.



Next I visited different companies. After visiting Rockstart Companies, I don't want to go abroad instead I will work in my own place. And among the company I visited, I liked the coffee shop which gave me an inspiration from Mr. Ashish Adhikari. If I get a chance to work there, I will work like Mr. Ashish in future. He has become a source of inspiration to me.

The only thing I didn't like about Kathmandu is pollution with dust and dirt. As a whole education tour was new and interesting to me.”

- **Sita Gautam:**

“I got second chance to visit Kathmandu and this time I got a chance to visit the places of Kathmandu as well. I liked different places of Kathmandu and among them I mostly liked Pashupatinath, Swayambhunath and zoo. The education tour was just new for me. I am very thankful to Mr. Mark who sponsored this educational tour and created link between the companies for visit and Mr. Dil who helped in giving details of every place.



I am interested with production work of wai wai. If I will get a chance to work in wai wai factory, I would work without any hesitation. It would me more well if the factory is near to Duhabi and Itahari.

I didn't like pollution and crowd of Kathmandu and also I had a very bad experience while travelling in bus.”

- **Amrit Gautam:**

“Educational tour was interesting for me. I liked every visit of educational tour. Everything was good and fine for me. The temples, historical places, monasteries were beautiful and attractive. It was amazing for me to see the view of Kathmandu valley from Swayambhunath. I liked to see the production of brick factory and how the brick is made. Rockstart companies helped me to be aware from working in Qatar which is dangerous. Overall, it was good in tour except dust and dirt of Kathmandu.”

Part 4

Staffs motivation points from two projects

Dipendra School:

- **Parvat Sanjel (Principal)**



“It’s me Mr. Parvat, Principal of Dipendra Primary School and I am here since 11 years. It has been a vast difference from the time since beginning to the present time. Previously, the number of Students was around 40-50, but it has been a drastic change where school has more than 105 students right now.

Basically, my motivation for serving in this school is to help in education although the salary is

low. As Dipendra School is located in remote areas, Children from those areas come to this school to get some knowledge. So, my intension is to do something and create awareness in the society through Children. Also, I would like to make a bright future of Children so that they can be a source of inspiration for the society and as a result, the society would be developed.”

“It’s been almost 3 years that I have joined this school and I have gained a lot of experience during my teaching period with the Children. Though I have a master degree qualification but I choose Dipendra School in order to change the situation of the Children with adequate knowledge and education. As the students of these areas are from low background so I want to provide equivalent education that I have learnt and to promote aware children and society about

social awareness through children. Also I want to aware children and society about various social evils that we come across in our life.”

“I am Jayanti Dhimal from Duhabi. I am currently working at Duhabi home as a home manager since 2016 September and as well as I give tuition class to them in order to improve their study. I have to look after management to housekeeping like school visit to assess academic and behavioral concerns, personal hygiene, monitoring school provisions, and writing reports on activities and follow up daily tutorial classes for the children. Besides these I know how hard for the children to live without their parents

so to make them filled with love is our responsibility. On working period I feel happy to see their smile on their faces whereas sometimes I experience powerlessness. But I presume I have the gift to work in the place and I have seniors who help me during the difficulties. I feel like I am a family member of the home with these kids.

Duhabi home chosen me and here I am working to generate change, protect the children and set them on a better path. For the improvement of Duhabi home and supporting the children to build up their career we are always here.”

“Namaste, I am Harimaya Kc from Duhabi home. It has been 5 years I am working as cook mother and serving the children providing nutritional food. As a cook mother at duhabi home, I have to schedule the daily menus. I have to stay informed about the children’s dietary limitation. I also have to assist in creating the food service menus. I also believe that we should serve and help the children who are alone and far

from the parents. I keep on helping these children future in every aspect of their life.”

“My name is Muna khatiwada. I am working as a home mother or caretaker at Duhabi



home since 5 years. Though I have less education but I can give happiness to these children. Giving cares to the children is like helping in giving shape to their future. It satisfies me when I work for them and do something for their improvement. It is also perceived as god’s work so I am here as to serve the children and help them. I am happy to be here as a home mother as I can make children happy and fill

up their requirement with my ability.”
