### Reports of Children: -

After the final terminal examinations, the children were promoted to the next classes, so new books, notebooks, and other stationery materials were purchased for them.

Some children required extra attention at home due to careless behaviour, such as not bathing for 3-4 days and not wearing clean clothes. After receiving feedback from staff members, the Office Manager (OM) discussed the issue with the counsellor and has been personally providing additional care and support to these children. The OM has taken responsibility for monitoring their behaviour, regularly checking their homework and classwork, and encouraging better hygiene and discipline. The children were provided with new school uniforms and shoes.

Anju is currently attending her final Class 12 terminal examinations and is fully focused on her studies. After the exams, she will have a college break of around five months before the results are published. During this free time, she can choose to join vocational training classes if she wishes.

A quiz competition was conducted among the children of Duhabi Home by dividing them into three groups. Prizes such as stationery items, notebooks, and pens were distributed to the winners.



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### Education: -

Khusi secured 87.6% in her Class 5 final examination and, her previous school didn't offer Class 6, she was admitted to a new one after promotion. Karan scored 85.75% and moved to Class 1, while Karuna achieved 94.23% and advanced to Class 3 where as Shristi progressed from Class 4 to 5, and Bijay, with 79%, was promoted to Class 3. Ram and Laxman both failed Class 4 and are repeating the year to improve. Pratima from Meghanand School scored 73.9% and promoted to Class 2.

From the new academic session, most children have been promoted to the next classes. The morning and evening tutors have been instructed to plan lessons and follow the syllabus provided by their respective schools. Asha Shah, the morning tutor, teaches junior students, while Binita, the evening tutor, handles the senior classes.

### Calamities: -

No any calamities happened at home.

### Staff Members: -

All staff members worked throughout the 30 days of April. However, the home mother and security personnel left Duhabi Home due to inappropriate behaviour and failure to follow the home's rules and regulations. We are currently searching for suitable candidates to fill these positions.

### Counsellor and activities: -

A brain test game and short movie session class was conducted, beginning with a brief review of the previous session. Thirteen children participated in the brain test game, which was designed to evaluate their cognitive abilities and thinking skills. The first activity involved matching letters (A-E) placed inside a simple box. Older children completed the task with ease, while younger ones found it more challenging; however, most managed to match all but 2 to 4



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of the simpler combinations. The second challenge, a dot-to-dot matching game, proved more difficult, with the majority of participants struggling to make accurate matches. Overall, the games encouraged creativity, cognitive engagement, and self-confidence among the participants.

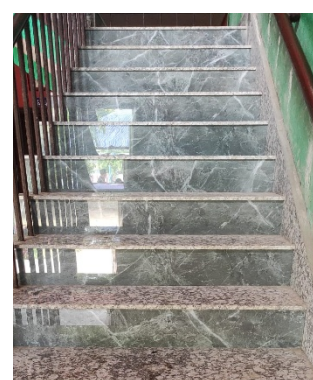
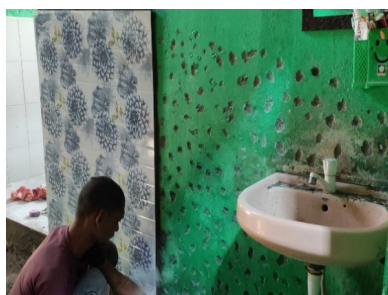


### Medical issues: -

Almost all the children were safe and healthy this April, with no serious injuries or illnesses. They were well cared for by the staff. However, Abhay's skin condition has not yet improved, and he requires better care and treatment. His wound is being cleaned regularly using antiseptic creams and Betadine. While most children remained healthy, younger ones occasionally got minor injuries while playing outside, and some girls experienced small cuts on their hands while helping their mothers with vegetable cutting at home.

### New project. -

By the last week of April 2025, the renovation work on the toilet and bathroom, including the installation of granite on the staircase and tiles in the bathroom, was almost completed. Only the kitchen and veranda work remained.







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### Child Club activity: -

A child club was formed at Duhabi Home, and roles were assigned to three selected leaders: The Discipline Leader, Sanitation Leader, and Informant Leader. The management team explained each role's responsibilities, and all children were encouraged to understand and support these duties. The leaders pledged to carry out their roles effectively and motivated others to be responsible as well. After the discussion, children were introduced to various game materials and participated in both indoor and outdoor games, such as carrom board and Ludo. All 12 children engaged actively, experiencing a range of emotions from joy to brief frustration, but overall expressed enjoyment in playing together.



### Points of attention: -

- Refrigerator is needed at home.
- A security guard and a home mother are needed at the home.
- The two-party agreement is currently underway.
